Man charged in Route 8 crash

STOW — A Cleveland man who crashed and flipped his compact SUV after losing control of the vehicle on Route 8 April 6 has been charged with failure to control, according to Stow Police.

Stow Police Chief Louis Dirker said witnesses told police they saw Michael A. Porter's 2001 black Kia Sportage flip over at 7 p.m. after Porter attempted to change lanes while driving southbound on Route 8, just north of the Graham Road exit.
